EVERY PET MATTERS

The goal of St. Augustine Humane Society (SAHS) is to ensure that all pets have access to veterinary care. We are always so busy and there is never enough space. Our waiting list is consistently two months in scheduling for much needed pet patient care.

To meet the needs of our community we are expanding the Community Veterinary Clinic, but need your help.



Since 2013, SAHS has provided spay-neuter and veterinary services for the St. Johns County area from the organization's 2,000-square-foot building, the original location since 1946.

In 2014, we brought the facility up to a standard of excellence with remodeling and new equipment with the help of PetSmart Charities. Since then, the response from the community has been overwhelming.

Today, the facility is at capacity which creates daily challenges for the staff, as well as for human and animal clients.

We have outgrown our initial renovation which limits our ability to provide ongoing care.

THE CLINIC HEALS

Operating as a certified ASPCA Humane Alliance solution to shelter pet overpopulation, SAHS performs more spay-neuter surgeries than any other clinic in St. Johns County, utilizing state-of-the-art equipment, medicines and medical practices. We cared for pets with skin issues, ear infections, kidney disease, and more.

The clinic provide preventative care that most pet owners take for granted.

Many of these pets wouldn't have received veterinary care, as we have truly become a financial safety net for pet owners and their pets in our community. The renovation would allow us to help more people meet the medical needs of their pets without additional financial burden.

THE LIMITATIONS WE FACE

Due to the current building layout and limitations, we cannot provide any other services while doing surgeries. With the physical expansion plans and needed funding, our veterinary clinic and lobby can remain open for services while surgery wing is in operating mode.

A new surgery wing will enable the St. Augustine Humane Society to more than triple the number of surgeries performed each year.

With the surgery wing in operation, the primary clinic building can be used to significantly increase affordable veterinary services to low-income pet owners, pets, and their families. Both spaces can be utilized simultaneously,

CURRENT STATUS OF CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

The estimated cost of the new surgery wing will be \$270,000 which includes construction, furnishings, and medical equipment. We've selected an experienced general contractor to help us with building plans and construction. The Board of Directors and the supporters of St. Augustine Humane Society are committed to building this very important addition.

We've already raised \$135,000, approximately half of the funds needed through savings, private donations, and fundraising.
